Horry Co. Historical Society Establishes Endowment

The Board of Directors of the HCHS has decided that something must be done to create a lasting "endowment" for the Society. After talking with representatives of the **Waccamaw Community Foundation**, the HCHS Board of Directors decided to join the Foundation.

What does this mean for HCHS?

– The Society must invest \$10,000 into the WCF in order to become a member. Once this is done, we will then be eligible to receive annual dividends on our donations in the form of grants from the Foundation. Hopefully, members of the community will remember the HCHS as they make financial gifts to community organizations and our "endowment" will grow. As it grows, so will our share of the annual dividends. The Society can then request these dividends for our annual operating needs.
